UKRANIAN APPEAL UPDATE



Thank you to all the staff, students and parents that have supported our Ukrainian appeal. Mrs Mitton and Mrs Newman have been blown away by the number of donations received. A group of staff and students worked hard after school last week to start to sort the items into different categories.

Due to the amount received, Mrs Newman arranged for a van on Wednesday afternoon to take the donations to a collection point in Birmingham where they have 50 trucks waiting to be filled before they head to Poland. This meant that we could extend the deadline for donations until Tuesday afternoon.

WHOLE SCHOOL ASSEMBLY FOCUSED ON UKRAINE CRISIS



On Tuesday this week we delivered a whole school assembly remotely via MS Teams on the ongoing Ukrainian Humanitarian Crisis as a result of the Russian invasion. We have been aware that lots of young people have questions around what has happened, and is continuing to happen in Eastern Europe and are anxious about how it will develop and we wanted to address this with them. Our assembly explored the causes behind the Russian invasion and historical context of Ukraine-Russian relations, discussed the international response to this and shared ideas of how we can support. Lots of students have said how they found this helpful to understand what is going on and will hopefully find this reassuring. We have reiterated to all students if they want to speak to anyone they can always speak to their tutor, HOY, Mrs Owen and Mr Biggs have set aside Wednesday afternoon 3:10-3:30pm (in 6b) as a time when students can come and ask any questions they have.
