We are delighted to share that we have secured an extracurricular partnership for September for our sixth form students with Port Vale FC.

Year 8 STEM club was focussed on forensics science this week. The students were tasked to find out who had killed a member of the science staff.

The students had to identify the pen used, using chromatography, compare fingerprints, analyse soil samples by seeing how they reacted with hydrochloric acid and decide on who had the biggest motive.

It was a tough task and required a lot of scientific skills to make the right decision.

Two groups narrowed it down to two suspects, one of which was correct, but only one group were able to identify the culprit outright.
