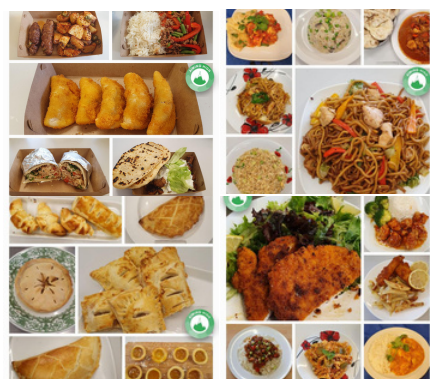

## GOOD LUCK!



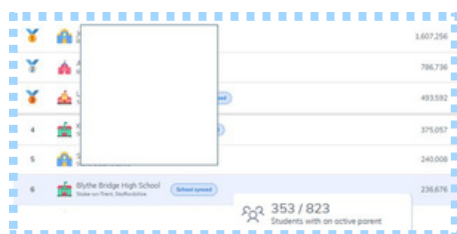
Wishing good luck to all our students whose exams get underway this week. Please remember there is a lot of support in school - just let your teachers know if there is anything you need.

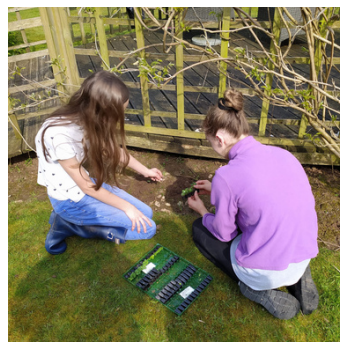
## ESCAPE ROOM BACK OPEN
